## **Milestones and Anniversaries**

Time is a major dimension in life itself and our history is measured by dates and also very much based on anniversaries such as Christmas and Easter being observed and remembered. We will be attempting to rectify this by creating an archival record that can be dipped into by future generations.

When we receive any request, providing this information and linking in with those carrying the work forward becomes a priority - and we include notes of these on our pages and alert our prayer partners. These often include an invitation to attend, which increasingly we ourselves can no longer do, but we can usually send a message of encouragement and will share this with you.

As we are reminded of our involvement in events now taking place, we do our best to recall relevant memories and papers. As this heritage ministry has spanned over 70 years, many changes have been made in the various ministries and groups formed carrying the vision forward, but interestingly there are usually attempts to go back to the roots to regain the original vision of what it was hoped would be achieved at the time of its formation.

We sometimes also find that we can be proactive in anticipating what may be needed. Much of the ministry in the past has made a useful contribution by highlighting and attempting to solve the then growing issues such as the racial prejudice that was becoming evident with the advent of the Windrush generation from the West Indies in the 50s which is still there under the surface of society today or the anticipated decline of the church in the 60s and 70s and the need for a new dimension of church growth.

There are so many links we will develop in this way in the future. Keep your eyes open and help us to learn from the past and to be forward-looking enough to plan for the future.
